The first day focused on community, the second on innovation and the third on change.

There were three well renowned keynote speakers. The first was Pak Tee Ng, Associate Dean, Leadership Learning at the National Institute of Education. He has written several books and numerous journal articles. He spoke about the success of the education system in Singapore which is rated high on the Pisa scale. In his breakout session he explained the initiative of **“teach less learn more”** in Singapore and discussed in how schools leaders and teachers can lead and implement this idea in practice.
